



Prep Your Vehicle for an Emergency

Some emergencies require a hasty evacuation. If your vehicle is always ready to go, you'll be able to hit the highway long before the rest of the crowd.

- Stay up to date with routine maintenance.
 - Oil changes
 - Air filter changes
 - Tire rotation and maintenance of proper tire pressure
 - Regular tune-ups
- Maintain the proper levels of important fluids.
 - Brake fluid
 - Antifreeze
 - Oil
 - Power steering fluid
 - Transmission fluid
 - Windshield wiper fluid
- Have extra parts & supplies on hand
 - Air and oil filters
 - Wiper blades
 - Extra bulbs for headlamps and brake lights
 - Store a tankful of extra fuel in a safe place and rotate.
- Attempt to keep fuel tank no less than half full.
- Keep spare tires properly inflated and insure you have all the necessary tools for changing a tire.
- Use a Sharpie to write the correct PSI for your tires on the front cover of your vehicle's manual.
- Keep at least one air pressure gauge in your vehicle.
- Have good road maps for your state and each surrounding state.
- Emergency supplies
 - Walking shoes and extra socks
 - Cash
 - Blankets
 - Well-equipped Vehicle/Emergency Bag
 - Sturdy work gloves
